A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As I walk through our hallways and into classrooms, I continue to be impressed by the level of enthusiasm and commitment for learning I am able to observe. Each day, I observe our teachers' efforts to develop and implement rigorous, yet creative, lessons that foster true student engagement. As a result, I observe students involved in academic discourse, problem-solving, reading, and critical thinking. Examples of these efforts are observable in each content area—at each grade level. Too numerous to articulate, but worthy of note in just the past two weeks, include: roundtable text-based discussions in 6th grade ELA, project-based learning focused on cell organisms in grade 7, and social studies simulations related to the Constitutional Convention in grade 8. If your child has yet to share these experiences with you, please ask them to “do tell!”

Speaking of experiences, this week we will acknowledge International Peace Day with a special *Pinwheels for Peace* activity during Friday's early release. *Pinwheels for Peace* is a project to support International Peace Day which is held annually on September 21st. In September, students learned about the meaning behind International Peace Day in their health classes. This learning then extended into art and technology education classes where students created and engineered their own pinwheels. We are pleased to report that students' pinwheels are now fully constructed and ready for public display. On Friday, our school community will be installing a *Pinwheels for Peace* Exhibit on the front lawn of our school. The exhibit will open officially with a musical celebration the students have been preparing during music classes under the direction of Ms. Belhumeur. It is our hope that students will connect this effort with the start of our advisory program to create a positive, peaceful environment.

Support for our Nashoba Chieftain football team is high and school spirit is strong. This school spirit makes us very proud of Nashoba. Many of our district middle school students have been attending our home football games to share in this spirit and join the fun. Most recently, it has come to my attention that while attending home football games, some of our district middle school students, who have attended unaccompanied by an adult, have been leaving the bleacher area for a period of time and then reentering the game or watching the game from an alternate location outside of the bleacher area. The high school grounds and facility are large and there are a many number of spectators in attendance. The high school has administrative staff and police officers who monitor the bleacher area and area immediate adjacent to the bleachers, but anything outside of the gated area is not actively monitored. - Producer:** Functions as a drama producer: supporting the director and the production as needed, helping to find solutions as problems arise

- Backstage Manager:** Oversees the students who are working backstage during tech week and the performances, and coordinates other parent volunteers who are helping backstage for show nights; Functions as a drama stage manager: keeping track of the blocking and actor instructions or needs for the play
 - Backstage Volunteer:** helping to oversee students during tech week and performances

- Set Manager:** Oversees the making of sets and scenery and coordinating any parents who help with this endeavor
 - Set Committee Volunteer:** Helps to make sets

- Prop Manager:** Oversees pulling together the prop donations and making/getting props still needed
 - Props Volunteer:** Helping to create any props which are needed

- Costume Manager:** Oversees the pulling together of costume donations and making/getting what is still needed and coordinates the parent volunteers who are helping with costumes; Functions as a drama costume designer: working in collaboration with the director to ensure costumes are integrated into the production
 - Costume Volunteer:** Helping to create costumes as needed

- Lights and Sounds Parent:** Oversees the students working lights and sounds; needed for rehearsals and performances

- Publicity Manager:** Oversees all aspect of publicity and coordinates parent volunteers
 - Poster Volunteer:** Designs flyers/posters for the show
 - Program Volunteer:** Puts together the information given into a cohesive program
 - Publicity Volunteer:** Promoting performances through newspapers, cable and district means

- Front of House Manager:** Coordinates everything needed for front of house: the volunteers for selling tickets, raffles, and kiss grams or other form of fundraising, decorating the front hallway and overseeing the intermission refreshments
 - Front of House Volunteer:** Helping with the needs of Front of House

- Photographer:** Taking pictures for head shots and cast picture and of occasional rehearsals
