1:1 Chromebooks

Our 8th graders will receive their 1:1 Chromebooks today, Tuesday, September 5. This year marks the third year of the Chromebook initiative. The 1:1 initiative presents learning possibilities for our teachers and students that have never before been possible. A personal mobile device offers students anytime, anywhere access to rich educational resources and 21st century learning experiences that align with the Massachusetts curriculum frameworks. Consistent access to a mobile device ensures that students are provided opportunities to use technology to create, collaborate, communicate and think critically. A 1:1 model enables teachers to regularly guide students in the ethical and safe use of technology and to use digital resources to personalize and self-direct learning. This digital learning model promotes equitable access to curriculum, differentiation of instruction and independent discovery.
